

There are only two theories of our origin. Let's talk about these two theories for a moment.

One theory aligns the sequence of events as recorded in the Bible over a very short period of time. This theory is often called "Special Creation." The second theory aligns the sequence of events with the so called "geologic column" over billions of years. This theory is often called "Evolution." These two theories are radically different and contradictory. They obviously cannot both be true.

Many people seem to think there is a theory, often called "Theistic Evolution" (others use the terms "Day-Age theory," "Gap theory," or "Progressive Creation") that somehow aligns God's word with evolution. This has absolutely no scientific basis. This is a non-scientific theological attempt to rationalize the two. There is not one single scientist or scientific institution studying evidence to suggest that God used millions of years of evolution to evolve life in the sequence of events as recorded in the Bible. Consequently, "theistic evolution" (or any of the other names that theologians call it), is not a theory. It is merely a non-scientific theological attempt to rationalize God's word with evolutionism.

This is not possible. As I say in all my presentations, "True science and God's true word always agree. Otherwise, by definition, one of the two has to be false." Both sequences of events cannot possibly be true. There is no scientific basis to believe they are both true. That is not possible.

Let's look at the four possible belief systems:

- 1) There are people (including scientists) who believe God's word (Christians) and the science that supports it.
- 2) There are people (including scientists) who believe in evolutionism (yes – a belief system) and do not believe the Bible (non-Christians).
- 3) There are people (including scientists) that do not believe in evolution because of its poor merit.
- 4) There are people (including scientists) that believe God's word AND evolution – only because they have never fully thought about the fact that they have based their belief system on a contradiction.

This is very sad. Three of the four scenarios have scientific support. The fourth has none. It is a shame that so many theologians have fallen for the fourth – falsely believing that their understanding of science and the Bible are in agreement. They are contradictory. This is especially sad in a day when creation science fully supports God's word – including the young age! This false belief is totally unfounded and would be easily reconciled if the individual would forget about his peer pressure, trust God, and look into a few areas of creation science.

In summary – Trust God! He is trustworthy. His word is trustworthy. We need never be ashamed or feel we have to "explain away" His word. It stands on its own!
